**Step 1** Find a participating optometrist at www.optometrists.ab.ca. Click on Find an Optometrist and **Eye See...Eye Learn**<sup>™</sup>, then enter your postal code to find a doctor close to you. **Call and book an appointment.** 

**Step 2** See your optometrist for the eye exam. Have your health card ready, because **the exam is covered by Alberta Health**.

**Step 3** If required, kindergarten students will **receive a free pair of eyeglasses**. Ask to see the frame selection available. The optometrist will order your glasses for you.

### It's a barrier free program for all kindergarten students

Eye See ... Eye Learn<sup>™</sup> is a free program available to all kindergarten students. It provides **free eye glasses** to any child who has had an eye exam with an optometrist and is found to need glasses. As all children's eye exams are covered by Alberta Health, the program is barrier

free for all kindergarten students. All their parents need to do is book an appointment and tell the clinic they are participating in the program.



# Why it's critical



- 80% of classroom learning is visual.
- 1 in 4 children have some form of vision problem.
- Many vision problems must be treated early in order to correct the issue.
- Children with vision problems are often misdiagnosed as having learning or behavioural disabilities.
- Children often don't know they have a vision problem, as they believe what there are seeing is normal.
- Parents often don't know their child has a vision issue, because these issues can be hard to spot particularly if there is a problem in only one eye.
- More than 43% of children who have a vision or eye health problem can pass a basic vision screening or sight test. A comprehensive eye exam by an optometrist is accurate and will check for a number of possible vision problems.
- Just as children grow, so too do their eyes. An annual eye exam is very important.
